The Magic of Merlin,

Merlin arrived at Holly Hedge along with nine other cats, all of whom had been living in a shed inside dog cages. When we initially checked Merlin over it was obvious that he was having problems with his ears. The skin on both was thickened causing a slight "cauliflower" look and both ears were very sore, hot to the touch and full of brown discharge. Our vet was immediately concerned and started him on ear drops. Although poor Merlin must have been in a lot of pain he allowed us to gently clean his ears and administer the drops. Merlin also needed a dental and so our vet decided this would be a good chance to examine his ears fully.

The news was not good, poor Merlin's ear canal was so scarred and narrowed from chronic ear infections that external cleaning and ear drops could no longer help. He needed a bi-lateral total ear canal ablation, a surgical procedure where all the diseased tissue: the entire ear canal, bones of the middle ear etc. are removed, the middle ear is drained, and the healthy tissue around the ear is closed. This sounded drastic but would end Merlin's long tribulation of pain. At £1000 it wasn't cheap but needed to be done.

A few weeks later, after some fund-raising, Merlin went off to the specialist for his operation. Happily for him, he only needed one ear done and although the vet said it would take between 4-6 weeks for him to recover fully (with a few unpleasant side effects) Merlin recovered well. He looked quite odd with his ear hole all stitched up and all his fur shaved on one side of his neck, but he was a very good patient. He enjoyed all the extra T.L.C. from staff and volunteers and was a very popular boy.

He is now lucky enough to have been adopted by Caroline and her husband and is living a very privileged life! We just wanted to say a big thank you for our two latest cats from Holly Hedge. A couple of months ago we took Patch, our sweet black and white cat, who, although about nine years old, is very petite and kitten-like.

It has been slow progress with Patch, him being one of the many cats Holly Hedge rescued from being kept in dog crates in a shed. Patch remains timid, although slowly builds in confidence as each day goes by. Patch gets on with other cats much better than he does humans, as he integrated very quickly with our original cat Vinnie.

A few weeks after taking Patch, we took another of the 'dog crated cats', Merlin, who is also about nine years of age. We were unsure of what reaction timid Patch would give when he saw Merlin, but it was so sweet, he came boldly out to meet Merlin, gave him a good sniff, and they actually looked pleased to see each other!

Merlin is still adapting to now being deaf in one ear, he frequently looks several times to see where any noise has come from, as this loss of hearing makes it difficult for him to work this out. Merlin does not like to be picked up, but this seems more because he just never had much human contact or perhaps love when he was younger. I should imagine that he coped by withdrawing into his own world when he was living in the shed, as he would have had very little to do, the poor thing.

He now spends most of his day just wandering about, investigating smells (especially food), and playing catch me if you can with Vinnie, our other cat. Merlin does also try to encourage me to chase him occasionally, he seems to think this is great fun.

One of the first things we bought for Merlin was a leopard print chaise longue, it was bespoke for his size as he is a large cat, and he loves it! He spends a lot of his time stretched out on his luxury chair.

So thank you Holly Hedge for coming to the rescue of these two troubled cats and giving them a second chance. My husband and I look forward to investing lots of time in making them feel comfortable in sharing our home, and watching their confidence grow. We love having them scampering about, and they certainly look very happy here.


Monty and Reuben went off on their travels again, this time to the Outer Hebrides in Scotland.


Dog Photo Competition
