HE PEN 28 KITT



In March 2012 4 pregnant cats came to Holly Hedge from a private breeder. The cats were all very scared, stressed and in need of medical attention to treat gingivitis, dirty ears and a severe flea infection. We made sure that they were seen by the vet for the urgent care they needed and made as comfortable as could be.

On April 20th, and during the following days, they gave birth to 18 kittens between them. They became known fondly to staff as The Pen 28 Kittens. The kittens too all needed treatment for ear mites and weepy eyes, which proved particularly troublesome as the mums were all so protective of their kittens. The kittens are now old enough to be without their mums, and some have already found loving new homes - and they are all doing well. When they go to their new homes we will ask for an adoption fee of £50 - £85 (depending on whether they are old enough to have yet been neutered, vaccinated and micro-chipped) - which is just a fraction of the amount that we have paid out for their care whilst with us.

This is just one story about one family of cats that we have cared for. So far this year we have already taken in over 350 cats, kittens, dogs and puppies; each with their own story to tell. Holly Hedge will make sure that the needs of each and every animal through our doors are met - but we can only do this with your help.




FUNDRAISING NEWS

So what's been happening?


