

MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

It is with a heavy heart that
I have to break the news
that Holly Hedge has less
than a year's running costs
left in our reserves, and
unless we are able to raise
at least £500,000 we may
not be able to continue to help

nearly as many desperate and needy cases. Our financial situation is largely due to building the new kennels which were so urgently needed, as the existing ones were dilapidated and crumbling. The dogs are so much happier in their new surroundings, and far less stressed, so a great result achieved – but at a huge cost.

Rising bills

Also our vet bills have risen considerably and reached a staggering £100,000 in the last financial year, as no animal is denied the veterinary help they need to enjoy the best quality of life. We have followed our hearts and carried out our solemn promise to do everything in our power to make our rescues pain free and whole again. We struggle financially to keep up with the insurmountable numbers coming to us in urgent need of veterinary treatment. Some poor souls have stoically endured excruciating pain for years before coming to Holly Hedge, and the difference made to their lives once treatment has been given is worth any amount of money spent to make them pain free and happy once more. Many have needed expensive operations to give them a new lease of life; others have been in road accidents with no owner coming forward and life-saving operations have had to be carried out or these poor souls would have died of their injuries.

Fighting to survive

We don't pick and choose all rehomeable dogs and cats we take in either. We take them off the streets, many living rough in pitiful conditions after fending for themselves for years, enduring starvation and freezing cold weather, fighting to survive in a harsh world, and learning the hard way that some people can be so cruel and heartless. At Holly Hedge they are shown love, kindness, given every home comfort possible, and shown that people can be caring and trusted. It is so heartwarming when their faith is restored once more, and they are ready to face the world again in a loving new home. We find homes for up to 800 rescues a year and the joy of seeing them go off to their lovely new homes is what keeps us all going.

Devoted and dedicated

Our staff is second to none and give all our rescues love in abundance as well as plenty of enrichment to help them cope in a kennel/cattery situation. Their devotion and dedication knows no bounds and the animals always come first. We have the best Managers ever, whose care and compassion shines through, and Holly Hedge couldn't be in better hands.

Going the extra mile

We cannot harden our hearts and refuse sick, elderly or injured animals, and we cannot contemplate refusing the treatment they need to enable them to lead happy, normal lives, some being on the brink of death and needing emergency medical treatment. We know we cannot save them all which is heart breaking, but we go that extra mile and try our very best to give them a future – which is our legacy of love no matter what the cost, it is only what these dear helpless creatures so richly deserve.

Future proofing

We have plans in place to sustain the future of Holly Hedge, and through kind friends have bought the field opposite which will generate income in the future, and enable us to apply for biodiversity grants and help dwindling wildlife also. No funding came out of the coffers as the field was purchased thanks to the kind help of Animal Friends Insurance, Pat Hopper, and all of us on the Board of Trustees. There are other cost cutting measures in place, as well as income generating strategies, but right now we are on a mission of survival, and we so desperately need your help to overcome the challenges that inevitably lie ahead.

Mending the broken pieces

Holly Hedge exists purely to help animals in need, and strives to give them all a much brighter and happier future. It costs £650,000 a year to keep the Sanctuary running to a high standard and give our rescues the best possible chance of a new beginning and a happy ever after. They come to us with broken hearts, broken limbs and broken spirits, and it is our job to put them back together again.

There is nowhere more totally committed to making a better life for those who have no voice. Please help us in our vital mission to always be there for animals who need our help.

Help us to help them

Thank you so much for reading this rather epic plea. It is truly a plea from the heart for all our precious rescues as we cannot contemplate letting them down. Please, please help us to help those dear souls who cannot speak for themselves. There is nowhere more totally committed and dedicated to turning their lives around for the better than Holly Hedge.

TED'S STORY

This poor emaciated Collie Huski mix came to us after he was found collapsed in a field, completely helpless, clearly exhausted and unable to stand up. To add to his discomfort, Ted was covered in faeces and urine, indicating that he had been locked up somewhere for a long time. He was in such a devastating condition that it just broke everyone's hearts. The photos show how terribly malnourished he was, weighing just 11 kilos on arrival, half what he should have been. He would not have survived another night lying out in the freezing cold.

Over the next few months, Ted had extensive ongoing veterinary care, regular check-ups and tests to ensure he had no damage to his internal organs, such as kidney failure due to the level of starvation. He also needed our love, time and affection. The changes in Ted both physically and mentally were astounding; this once weak, starved, shy boy became a different dog - confident, outgoing and twice the size! This transformation eventually led to us finding him his perfect forever home where we're sure he will live out the rest of his days in the knowledge that he is finally safe.

PEPPER'S STORY

This dear little cat came to us as a desperately poorly looking stray in real need of TLC and urgent veterinary treatment. Pepper was so thin and emaciated and had a dreadful skin infection on his tummy and back legs. He also had a cleft palette. Despite the terrible condition he was in and the suffering he must have been enduring, Pepper was still full of purrs and really keen to climb onto our laps for cuddles and love, which he clearly hadn't had for a very long time, if ever.

It really was touch and go for a while as to whether he would pull through but, as always, we were determined to do everything we could to give this stoic little lad the best possible chance of survival and a happy future to look forward to. After lots of medical attention and love from our dedicated staff and volunteers, it didn't take long for Pepper's 'forever family' to come along and fall in love with him.

Pepper's outcome and complete recovery is just one of many examples of Holly Hedge's dedication to the wellbeing of each and every one of our beloved cats and kittens and we are fully aware that we couldn't achieve such success without the incredible support of all the kind people who donate to our ever increasing vet bills.

KITTEN & PUPPY SEASON

This year, once again, we have seen an increase in our very youngest residents arriving, and sadly many of our kittens have come in alone as little orphans. With the rise in sales on the internet the last ones in the litter may struggle to be sold, and sadly some end up turned out with no home of their own. We are also faced with stray cats still not being neutered, having their babies on the streets, with people finding them and taking them to safety, but sadly many don't survive if removed too young and it is always crucial to contact a rescue if you suspect you may have feral or stray cats in your gardens or workplace who appear to be pregnant or nursing.

We take many of these little souls who we nurse back to health often feeding through the night whilst providing all the medical help they may need. With many cats not being vaccinated we are also seeing a rise in cat related viruses which can affect their immunity system meaning regular trips to our vets, antibiotics and round the clock nursing.

At least they know they will be matched to the right homes and have all the medical care they need.

Arnold, along with some of his brothers and sister unfortunately suffer from a condition called distichiasis, which means he as multiple extra eyelashes in both eyes. These extra lashes grow at an odd angle and rub on the surface of his eyes, causing discomfort and pain, often causing corneal ulcers. Whilst our vet is able to pluck these lashes to give him some relief, this is only a temporary solution and the lashes will regrow. At some point in the future Arnold and possibly his siblings will need referring to an Ophthalmology Veterinary specialist, who will most likely have to surgically remove each lash and its hair follicle. This is highly specialist treatment requiring specialist equipment, and, as such, doesn't come cheap. We have been advised that his treatment may cost £2500. Although this is a huge amount of money, we really want Arnold to have a pain free life. So please help us to help him by donating to his cause and to help others who sadly without our help may never have the happy ending they deserve.



HOLLY HEDGE FARM & SMALL FURRIES

We have some very special residents who have come to Holly Hedge over the last few months. Some of you may not know that although we predominantly rehome cats and dogs, we occasionally get an unusual resident or two in urgent need of a safe place to stay.

However, with Holly Hedge resembling Noah's Ark, with the arrival of two Pygmy goats, two hamsters, a chicken and a cockerel, three bunnies, a Shetland Pony called Minty and another called Millie! we have certainly been kept busy at the Holly Hedge farm! Thanks to a brilliant team of corporate volunteers, we were able to clear out and restore an old temporary kennel block that has been used for storage for a long time creating new housing for small animals... however with a bit of modification we were also able to create a small stable just right for our goats who were with us just a few days before being rehomed, thus making way for our largest resident Minty the pony who was in urgent need of a rescue space to avoid being given away for free on Facebook. He has such specific needs and with many horse rescues bursting to capacity, we felt it essential to offer him a safe haven.

All of these residents have managed to find experienced homes with the best possible housing but we still have our beautiful long haired Rabbits still looking for a home.

Sadly, many hamsters and small animals are bought and sold in pet shops, usually with insufficient housing, not enough space, extremely small hutches and cages, and after the novelty wears off, many of those small animals will find themselves neglected or in rescue. They are not easy to keep, and it takes time and money to care for them properly. However we are hoping that with the addition of suitable housing, we will be able to offer a safe haven to those who will come to need our help in the future.

A wild flower meadow for butterflies & bees and doggy heaven

A local housing development is affecting woodland & wild life habitat.

The woods next to the Sanctuary site in Wild Country Lane was taken over by a housing developer and building work north of Barrow and Church Wood began in 2016.

Damage to the ancient woodland and the effect on our neighbouring woodland creatures could not be ignored, which is why Holly Hedge Trustees decided to purchase the field next to its entrance to provide a haven for wildlife, and restore lost habitat.

With the help of an Avon Wild Life Ecologist, plans were discussed to create a wild flower meadow, build a stone bat folly and install a wild life pond. The meadow will provide a safe haven for wildlife, bringing local bats, birds, deer and woodland creatures under the protection of the Sanctuary.

The new meadow will also offer 3. 5 acres of open space for Holly Hedge Rescue Dogs to run free.....

Our dogs have historically walked the woodland since the Sanctuary opened in 1992 and because of strict safety rules must always be exercised on harness and on a lead.

Our play paddocks are fun, but too small for properly running free. Happily, the new Freedom Meadow will give the dogs plenty of open space to run and explore.

This Conservation Biodiversity Project is being funded with a Grant from VIRIDOR CREDITS ENVIRONMENTAL COMPANY

Everyone involved with Holly Hedge would like to extend their gratitude and heartfelt thanks to Viridor Credits for the Grant to fund our Meadow Project installations which will help to protect our neighbouring wildlife and enable us to create and enhance habitat.

The support will also help to launch our Wild Flower Meadow Campaign and widen our education programme.



LETTER FROM OUR BEHAVIOURIST



Settling in your new rescue pet into its forever home

When we adopt a rescue dog or cat, it's an exciting time for us. We usually have expectations of how our new pet will slot into our lives. Hopefully the rescue centre will already have provided a decent handover, addressing any specific needs relating to the animal who is being taken home. Sometimes the handover might be done relatively quickly once the home check has been passed, and other times it might be done slowly over several weeks, so that the new owner and animal can get to know one another and training protocols can be fully understood.

Every animal who ends up in rescue has a different history and unique temperament and personality. Whether they have been adopted from a kennel environment or a temporary foster home, their ability to adapt to their forever home is going to vary depending on the individual.

There are some dogs and cats who will largely be unphased by their recent transitions between temporary and permanent homes and who will adjust to their new environment,

> routine and family members with ease. However, these animals are likely to be in the minority and most will require a gentle and understanding introduction and settling-in process. Try to avoid visitors whilst your new pet is settling in, despite how keen you might be to introduce them to friends and family.

Confused cats

It can be common for cats to find the best place to hide, or the highest place, and stay there for a certain amount of time until they are confident enough to explore their new environment and interact with family members. It's sensible to just leave them be, and allow them to decide to venture out and initiate human interaction in their own time. For these cats, sometimes allocating them with their own room with everything they need (that becomes their 'core territory') and gradually increasing the area available to them, can help them feel safer and more secure.

Different dogs, different needs

Some dogs may require company for a while before attempting to separate yourself from them, both when you are still home or when you leave the house. This may be days, or weeks. Other dogs may actually need some space from humans and some may only settle properly when they are left alone. Some may find the outside world overwhelming and wont require walks initially, whilst they adjust to their new home environment and then walks can be introduced slowly so that the dog finds the experience calm and positive. Other dogs may only be able to fully relax when they are out on a walk, and find the home environment more challenging. The key thing is to try not to have any expectations and to listen to the dog you have in front of you, providing them with as many ways to be as relaxed and settled as possible.

Three is the magic number

Behaviourists often refer to the phrase "three days, three weeks, three months" when chatting to owners of new rescue dogs. The first three days dogs are often in an inhibited state, where they may not have much of an appetite and don't show too much of themselves. During the first three weeks, they are likely to start settling in but this period is still classed as the 'honeymoon period' and the dog wont start fully fitting into its new routine or be exhibiting its normal behaviour until about 3 months. It can be normal for new owners to think "what have we done?!" at some point during the settling-in process, especially when expectations are not meeting reality. Support should be provided by the rescue during these times, but it is also important to try not to have any expectations when adopting a new pet but instead try to 'go with the flow' and take it a day at a time.

Introductions to existing pets

The introductory process to an existing pet is one of the most important factors in a successful future relationship together. Whether you are introducing a dog to an existing cat, a cat to an existing dog, a dog to an existing dog or a cat to an existing cat, it is really important that both the new pet and the existing pet both have their own space. With dogs, babygates (or dog gates) are essential. Time together should always be supervised and food, chews, toys and other valued resources should be managed appropriately to prevent any conflict. Cats will need their own separate core areas, with separate feeding and drinking stations, numerous litter trays and a very slow introduction. Dogs must ALWAYS be prevented from chasing a cat, so a lead should be used whenever the dog and cat are in visual contact (even with a gate that the dog can charge at).

If you have any queries relating to the introductory process, chat to the rescue before

taking your new pet home so that you can be sure you are setting them up for success from the start. If it all goes smoothly, in a few weeks time you won't be able to imagine life without them!

Milly - now Ivy



HOW YOU CAN HELP HOLLY HEDGE

We always need volunteers to join our friendly team of fundraisers. There are so many events and activities that take place throughout the year, there really is something for everyone, from a few hours a month to as much time as you would like to commit.. 




