

They are also Patrons of Holly Hedge and we are so privileged that they are taking time out of their very busy schedule to cut the ribbon and say a few words.

BUILDING FOR A BETTER FUTURE

In the past year Holly Hedge have rehomed 166 dogs and 319 cats, 1 ferret, and 1 rabbit. We are in more demand than ever with kitten season being all year round and the numbers of both dogs and cats on our waiting list needing help has risen considerably.

Home from home

Holly Hedge is once again in the throes of major building work to increase the comfort of our animals and improve working conditions for our devoted staff. Our existing dilapidated kennels have now been demolished to build new, much cosier kennels, where our rescued dogs will be housed in far nicer surroundings until their forever homes are found. This will incorporate a kitchen area where our rescues can hear (and smell) their food being prepared to make it seem a little more like home. The project should be completed, (hopefully) by Christmas. In the meantime 12 temporary kennels have been constructed which means during this time we will unfortunately be taking in 8 less dogs until completion of the new building. We have appealed for foster homes over this crucial time, but we still desperately need more to accommodate emergencies. This period will cause upheaval to both staff and our rescues, but the end product will be worth waiting for.

Once the new kennels are completed, building work will continue to transform our existing medical room, dog shower room, and grooming room into 3 good sized rooms with fencing around for our long term dogs' comfort. This will give a more 'homely' feel to their surroundings, will be much cosier and also be spacious enough for them to have their own settees.

Our existing kitchen/prep room area will then be converted into a veterinary area, incorporating a grooming/shower room area, so lots of improvements going on to benefit our rescues.

Cat paradise

Once our rescued dogs are established in their new surroundings, then it will be the cats' turn for a refurbishment. Already their large enclosed cat garden has been made even more interesting with lots of different climbing frames, shelves, and little houses, also cat friendly plants. Huge thanks to Bruce and Celia, 2 of our dedicated volunteers who have been busy making the garden a cat's paradise for them to play in and enjoy. The kittens especially, have a whale of a time charging around and exploring, and give our staff a run for their money when they try rounding them up to take them back to their catteries so others can take a turn!

It has been quite a tumultuous year, especially with road closures in Wild Country Lane going on for months on end, and now our car park temporarily being full with containers and builders vehicles, making parking difficult at times. That said, it's all work in progress!

Talking point

The new Meeting/Training Room and Café area are proving very popular, especially with our volunteers, and we are in the process of booking more talks relating to Animal Welfare and Training, to include Animal First Aid and a Dog Law Seminar. This should be of interest to pet owners, and especially to Holly Hedge adopters, so keep an eye on our Website and Facebook page for more information. Talks by Tina Constance, a world renowned Tellington Touch Practitioner, and Caroline Ingraham, of the Ingraham Academy of Zoopharmocognosy have proved extremely popular and enlightening, and we hope to have the privilege of their wealth of knowledge and expertise again in the near future. Grateful thanks to both Tina and Caroline for giving their invaluable services free of charge with all proceeds going to Holly Hedge.

Charity begins at home

Our two Charity Shops in Clevedon and Nailsea continue to be an asset To Holly Hedge and a valued source of income. Kat and her dedicated team of volunteers are doing an excellent job, and we are so grateful to all the kind people who donate such lovely goods for us to sell.

What retirement!?

Most people will know by now that I have (sort of) retired. However, I am still actively involved with the Sanctuary and still continue much the same as ever. I am nowhere near ready to take up knitting or flower arranging (perish the thought), and I

hope to continue for many more years to come. That is of course, unless the brain ceases to function and I become catatonic! Seriously, though, I hope to be of use to the animal kingdom until such time as it becomes impossible for me to do so.

Christmas is fast approaching, and already plans are underway to make the festive season as happy as we possibly can for our rescues, who sadly won't be lucky enough to be in their forever homes.

YOUR SANCTUARY NEEDS



It costs £8,500 a week to run Holly Hedge and with ever more needy animals ending up at our door, we are struggling.

If we are to continue to offer a safe haven for animals in need; including older animals (who may need ongoing medication), nervous animals (that take a lot of time and patience to bond with and train) and unvaccinated and unneutered animals (our veterinary fees cost us over £75,000 a year), we need your help!

What can you do?

There are lots of ways you can help us raise money.

- Buy a raffle ticket it is time for our Christmas raffle, tickets are available at the sanctuary and both our charity shops. They are priced at just £1 per ticket and with amazing prices such as a 32 inch TV with stand (Donated by the wonderful Clive and Shelia) and a £100 Grooming Voucher at The Grooming Emporium it cannot be missed.
- Send us a little something from our Amazon Wish List.
- Hold a *coffee morning* with friends you get to spend time with your nearest and dearest and raise funds for our rescues at the same time.
- Sponsor a kennel or cat pen for as little as £5 a month.
- Pledge a few hours every month (or as often as you can) to take part in one of our supermarket collections. These happen all over Bristol so you should be able to find one local to you.
- Attend one or more of our fundraising events. We have something for everyone, from cabaret nights to our famous Fun Day at Ashton Court.
- Get sponsored. Ever wanted to run a marathon or do a bungee jump? Now's your chance! Contact Holly Hedge for help with sponsorship forms and organising.
- · Organise a work event.

- Get a collection tin or bucket for your office, front desk or canteen perhaps your employer will match the amount you raise. Ask your employer if they can send an internal email to all your company's employees to let them know what you are up too!
- Organise an office dress up or dress down day, charging everyone a nominal fee to take part (you could even set a fine for those who forget). Whether you decide to dress up to the nines, or even come as cats and dogs, you know it'll be a riot.
- Hold a *lunch time feast*; whether it's a cake and sweet sale or you opt for finer dining, you can get everyone involved. Ask some of your colleagues to bring in a few dishes or treats and then invite the whole office along, with everyone paying for some lunch treats!
- Please consider remembering Holly Hedge when making your will. Let your legacy be to give other homeless animals that second chance.
- When you shop on-line use easyfundraising.org.uk and each purchase you make will generate a cash back donation to Holly Hedge. Simply register and choose Holly Hedge as your chosen charity. You can then shop as normal with 2000+ brand name retailers, including Next, Amazon and Ebay, and use the links from the site to raise money for the sanctuary at no extra cost to you.

If everyone who has had an animal from us, who volunteers, who comes to visit or who cares about what we do, could aim to raise £250 for Holly Hedge during 2015, together we could make all the difference.

A Happy Endings with an appeal to everyone out there to give big dogs a chance. We find the larger dogs stay with us at Holly Hedge far longer than their smaller kennel mates which is a crying shame – the bigger the dog, the bigger their heart! Emelia is sharing her experience in adopting a larger-than-life dog from Holly Hedge.

I spotted Mabel on the Holly Hedge website in June 2011 and thought she looked just gorgeous. I was away studying abroad, but told the rest of the family about her and kept my eye on the Holly Hedge website, hoping that she'd be adopted and be happily settled soon. Sadly, I saw that Mabel was still there every time I looked. Mabel is a bullmastiff x boxer and is a big, bouncy girl full of energy. I began to realise that big dogs in animal sanctuaries often have a very long wait ahead of them, as people believe that they might be far more trouble than a small animal, or are scared of them.

After watching Mabel stay at Holly Hedge for months and months, I persuaded my family to drive up to the sanctuary and meet her. We fell in love with her instantly; she had about 10 balls in her kennel and joyously pushed them through the gaps in the wire for us to throw back to her, her tail wagging so hard that it was just a blur! Playing ball is still her favourite thing in the world. Within two weeks, she was coming home with us.

Mabel had been in a violent household, had witnessed lots of nasty things, and had been left locked up for a long time in a bathroom in an empty flat before she was found and taken to Holly Hedge.

As with any rescue animal, the first few months were very hard and a lot of patience and love was needed. But we never gave up on trying to give Mabel a happy place to live. She's such a big and powerful girl, but is the most gentle creature you could imagine. She thinks she is one of us! She sits next to us on the sofa, her head resting on our shoulders, sits in her chair whilst we eat at the table so that she can join in with the meal, and loves to sleep cuddled up against someone so that she knows you're still there.

In the three years we have had her, she has changed so much. It just takes a little time. She is calm, happy and settled and loves nothing more than to be with her family.

We love Mabel more than anything and want to put out a plea to those looking for a dog to share their home with; please don't overlook big dogs. They may look a little intimidating to start with, but are gentle giants and have so much love to give!





It can take a long time for our older residents to find their forever homes and they often get overlooked. This breaks our hearts as they are such wonderful, loyal companions with so much love to give and they all deserve a happy, relaxed and pampered retirement. Hi, my name is Mia (but now it's MiMi)





We sat out in the garden with her and then my son found a tennis ball and started playing with her. She started to relax then and clearly loved playing ball. It's still her favourite game now and we often joke that she would keep chasing the ball until she dropped down with exhaustion if we let her. She is so fast, we've yet to meet another dog that can out run her. Unfortunately sometimes her enthusiasm gets the better of her though as she will dash off before the ball is thrown and go in the wrong direction!!

I found it very difficult to talk about and Pauline fully understood. Some weeks went by and during one of my usual visits to Holly Hedge, Pauline placed a slice of ham in my hand and asked if I would sit in a kennel with a traumatised,

malnourished, nervous and very frightened dog who was too scared to eat and petrified of everyone. 'Juliana' as she was named was a small black lurcher cowering in the corner of the pen, afraid to move or even enter the inside kennel. It was quite obvious she had been starved, her ribs and haunch bones stuck out through her thin body. She had been beaten and generally ill treated. She came over from Ireland where she had been in a Pound on Death Row.

Eventually, after visiting for five days with roast lamb, chicken and steak and sitting quietly with her, she began to take food from me and seemed to recognise me when I arrived. On the sixth day, my husband visited with me and, as they say, the rest is history. She came home with us and met Jack, Misty and Patch. It was quite obvious that she had never had a bed to sleep on or eaten out of a dog bowl, but day-by-day she learned from the other dogs what life should be like. It took her three weeks to join us in the lounge; she stayed in the conservatory, peering in through the door. She had obviously never seen a TV before, as she was scared of voices coming out of a box! We let her take everything at her own pace and now, nearly a year later, she has been spayed by keyhole surgery and is a very happy, loving friendly dog who learns very quickly, is brilliant with commands and very intelligent. She has learnt that the kitchen worktops and fridge is not a self-service outlet and it that it is unacceptable to help yourself to food from the plates of visiting friends! It is a joy to watch her relaxing

playing and enjoying being a K9 who doesn't need to be afraid. Jess, (my husband renamed her as he couldn't imagine being out in the fields calling 'Juliana'!!) gives us so much pleasure. Pauline knew exactly what she was doing when she placed the slice of ham in my hand and we are so pleased she chose us, (without us knowing) to share our lives with such a wonderful dog who is now definitely 'safe and sound'.

So I shall always be eternally grateful to Holly Hedge for rescuing me and for turning my life around. What a wonderful place.

SCRUMPY





Christmas Shoebox Appeal




Providing shelter from harm and the promise of a brighter future
